Deepen Learning

Due to the dedication of our teachers and staff, most of our students excelled on the annual STAR Assessments, with many students scoring two or three grade levels ahead in both math and reading. More detailed grade-by-grade data are shown on pages 8-9. Amazing coaching by our teachers and staff guided our student teams to awards in wideranging extra-curricular academic competitions. During the 2022-2023 school year we participated in the Diocesean Academic Decathlon, Science Fair, Battle of the Books, and Knowledge Bowl. This is a testament to the hard work of our school team, students, and parents, as well as the innovation of our school leadership team.

Continuous Improvement

In an effort to support our teachers as they enrich their professional careers, the board believes that it is important to provide time for our teachers to collaborate, receive professional development, and work within their professional learning communities (PLCs). These endeavors will have many positive effects on our students and will improve an already stellar education at St. Francis Parish School. PLC interactions will allow us to work on WASC certification, review the effectiveness of our curriculum vertically across grade levels and look at effective approaches to differentiated learning.

Building a Supportive, Faith-based Community

We pride ourselves on the strength of our Catholic community, which includes teachers, staff, students, parents, and parishioners. We offer weekly Mass on campus, and parents are welcome to attend! Here at St. Francis, we celebrate our faith and traditions throughout the year, with All Saints Day and St. Albert's Science Day in November, a Christmas music program in December, Stations of the Cross during Lent, Easter celebrations, and May Crowning & First Holy Communion in May. We strive to live out our faith & love for our neighbors with food collections for local charities and providing Blessing Bags to feed the hungry here in our hometown.


FINANCIAL STATEMENT


We planned the year with a budget for 357 students enrolled, not counting the preschool. When school started, we had an enrollment of 373 students and ended the year with 366 students. We budgeted a profit for the year of \$55,000 plus fundraising, in order to rebuild our reserve account and allow for much-needed CapEx items. We finished the year just below our target profit but we were able to increase our CapEx spending due to our incredible donors and all of your fundraising support. Our Finance Committee would once again like to thank all of our teachers and staff for the hard work and commitment to provide an excellent learning experience for our students. We had a wonderful year due to the love, prayers, and the support of our parents, students, staff, and families here at St. Francis Parish School. We look forward to many more successful years!

Fundraising is a crucial supplementary income for our school. Tuition makes up the majority of our income and that is used primarily to cover the actual costs to educate each child. Our school receives additional funds through fundraising and grants that we use for additional expenses such as building and ground maintenance, exploring, procuring, and training in new programs.
